#### FOR THE USE OF THIS NARRATIVE BUDGET BOOK

Each year, the Harmony Creek Church Finance Committee produces a carefully planned operating budget for the following year. The **annual budget** is prepared with a great deal of analysis, prudence, consultation, and prayer. The budget lists the church's income and expenses in detail, and the Finance Committee presents the budget at the Annual Meeting for approval by our congregation.

That line-item budget shows our funds and costs; it provides the financial structure for our Committees to responsibly manage and faithfully track those figures. It is black and white, finely categorized, and number oriented. What **YOU** hold here is something different, an illustrated narrative budget, and we hope it adds to your understanding of the church's work and finances.

This annual narrative budget describes the <u>same</u> income and expenses. It highlights our activities and accomplishments, and shows how our income is gathered and how it is spent across principal aggregate ministries, associated ministries in separate funds, and the costs required for the management of our human resources and property/grounds.

May this narrative budget inspire you with our shared successes, and encourage your continued involvement and generosity for our future together doing ministry & seeking justice.



#### **Our Income**


How are all of Harmony Creek Church's good works accomplished? Harmony Creek Church is funded mainly by our own generosity, as is true for most congregational churches. A full 86% of the income in our annual budget comes from our own pledges, gifts, and special donations. Our church's ministries highlighted in this booklet, and truly all of God's work we strive to do, are only made possible by our own commitment and gifts.



#### **Our Budget Distribution**

Your generosity directly supports the mission and ministries of this thriving church. The Harmony Creek Church income supports: our wonderful pastoral, musical and administrative staff; the support services and maintenance of our building and grounds; Salon fellowship and church worship; and, notably, the caring and support for our congregation and the community. #### Help Us Change the Negative Trend in our Finances

Over the past few years, Harmony Creek Church has experienced a concerning downward trend in financial pledges and overall giving, which has directly impacted our assets and operating budget. Despite the church building's sale and our best efforts to manage expenses, this decline in contributions has put a strain on our ability to maintain essential ministries, programs, and community outreach.

Our church's 2025 budget year is no exception:

Total 2025 Revenues: \$232,600 Total 2025 Expenses: \$305,183

2025 Budget Deficit: \$232,600 - \$305,183 = - \$72,583

If this trend continues, we face the very real possibility of depleting our financial reserves within the next two and a half years. This is a pivotal moment for our church, and we need to come together in faith and commitment to ensure that Harmony Creek can continue to be a place of worship, service, and fellowship for generations to come.


#### Pianist - Leah McCain

Building & Maintenance – 14.8% \$45,080.00

Our Building and Maintenance Team ensure the supervision, maintenance, repair, and long-range planning for our portion of the church's building, grounds, and property.

The team develops and maintains appropriate policies, procedures, and fees for the use of the church's facilities by groups and individuals both inside and outside the church.

We strive to keep our facilities clean and set up for worship, Salon, and community services. It is good to be reminded that part of our budget goes for such things as:

- Monthly leasing
- Utilities (e.g., Internet)
- Custodial support
- Snow removal contract
- Insurance

This is our meeting place – the setting for all our worship, Salon, fellowship, and faith formation activities. We desire a safe, clean, and welcoming building and grounds for all.





Harmony Creek Church may be a relatively new church but we have long and historic roots in the Miami Valley dating back to 1833, sharing a rich tradition of ground-breaking firsts and justice-seeking extending back centuries.

#### **Youth Ministry**

Our HCC Youth Group is truly thriving at this stage in the life of our church. The youth group meets multiple times a month, engaging in spiritual practices, enjoying social activities and outings, completing mission and ministry projects, and participating in worship services and other gatherings with the full body of the church. In addition to our "All Youth" Youth Group, we offer Confirmation Classes every other academic year and Our Whole Lives (OWL) Classes for various age groups, ideally offered during alternating academic years.

Our youth participate each summer with youth from other progressive churches at Beloved Youth Camp at Laurel Ridge Retreat Center.
Our youth fund raise for this event.







#### Children's Ministry

Our children's programs bring life to ministry and create an environment where all children can thrive. Every child deserves a place where they can feel free to ask questions, be accepted, and learn how to love themselves and the community around them.



## Our Work **Beyond** the Budget Line Items

The 2025 Annual Budget doesn't tell the whole story about our Church's ministry and work. Our Harmony Creek Church Administration, Council, committees, teams, volunteers, and even our building and grounds all work together to execute a broader ministry... to serve our fellow citizens of the local and global community, to be stewards of the environment & all of God's creatures, and to seek justice and freedom for all.

Your contributions and commitments achieve a **world of good**. Some initiatives, such as the Cuba Fund and Food Pantry, are captured in individual accounts (or, separate funds similar to savings accounts). The pie chart below shows those individual funds, and the next few paragraphs list some of the initiatives our active church members support.



#### Feeding Friends Food Pantry – Other Funds & Initiatives

Our job as a church is to serve our community. Our **food pantry feeds many** in our community and is a ministry we strive to support.

Our food pantry offers the community can goods, fruits, vegetables, bread products and frozen meats, and toiletries such as shampoo, soap, and other personal products. We are happy to serve you!

#### Social & Environmental Justice Ministry – Other Funds & Initiatives

#### Voter Empowerment Team

We affirm that <u>each person</u> is created in the image of God and deserves full citizenship rights. This ministry team promotes voter participation and empowerment and provides information and opportunities for activism as the rights of voters, particularly people of color and those who are poor, continue to be threatened.

#### Refugee Ministry

Our church is currently partnering with a large family from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) that has been resettled in Dayton. We are continuously enriched by this relationship as the children blossom and the family works toward self-sufficiency.

#### Cuba Ministry

This March we welcomed Sao, co-pastor of the HCC former partner church in Havana, Cuba, into our country through a new immigration program. Since his arrival he continues to meet with our church's Meditation Group where his spiritual poetry is discussed. Poems and reflections are shared via the Currents and the church Facebook page. This ministry partners with the Refugee Ministry in facilitating Sao's resettlement into our country and our UCC faith communities.

#### **Environmental Ministry**

Our Environmental Ministry works to do the following:

- Educate our congregation on important environmental issues
- Provide our congregation with tips on living more sustainably
- Bear witness to the interconnectedness of all life
- Live with respect for the environment and all living things
- Act in defense of environmental justice
- Enrich our congregation with the celebration of and appreciation for the great gift that is creation



#### **Annual Pet Blessing**

We have a special blessing service & each pet is given a collar charm. We partner with Ellie's Rainy Day Fund to help other pets in the area.

#### Pet Food Pantry

We pack up bags of dog & cat food each week to hand out to our furry food pantry visitors.
